

Rhodes State College Radiographic Imaging

Program Effectiveness Data

The following data are from the Radiographic Imaging program's 2015 Program Annual report (PAR) submitted in October of 2016 to the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology (JRCERT):

Credentialing Examination Pass Rate: Credentialing examination pass rate is defined as the number of graduates who pass, on first attempt, the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) certification exam compared with the number of graduates who take the examination within six months of graduation.

The program's average first attempt pass rate for the five-year period from 2011 through 2015 is 95%. During this period 76 of 80 graduates were successful on first attempt.

Job Placement Rate: Job placement rate is defined as the number of graduates employed in the radiologic sciences compared to the number of graduates actively seeking employment in the radiologic sciences. The JRCERT has defined not actively seeking employment as: 1) graduate fails to communicate with program officials regarding employment status after multiple attempts, 2) graduate is unwilling to seek employment that requires relocation, 3) graduate is unwilling to accept employment due to salary or hours, 4) graduate is on active military duty, and/or 5) graduate is continuing education.

The program's average job placement rate for the five-year period from 2011 through 2015 is 85%. During this period 55 of 65 graduates actively seeking employment obtained employment in the radiologic sciences within twelve months of graduation.

Completion Rate: Program completion rate is defined as the number of students that complete the program within 150% of the stated program length of five semesters divided by the number of students who initially enrolled in the program. Students who leave or do not graduate on time for any reason, such as medical leave, personal choice, or course failure, are considered as not completing the program with the original cohort.

The program's completion rate for 2015 was 43.8% which reflects that 14 students of the originally enrolled 32 students completed the program in 2015.
